A generously-sized scarf or rectangular shawl with a striking zig-zag lace pattern, using one skein of Scrumptious Lace silk and merino luxury yarn.



Needles and accessories

1 pair US size 7 [4.5mm/UK 7] knitting needles
Stitch markers (optional)

Gauge

20 sts and 24 rows to 4in [10cm] over lace pattern, relaxed after blocking (approximate measurements as the lace pattern is very stretchy when worked at this gauge)

Pattern notes

If you are new to knitting lace patterns, you may find it helpful to place stitch markers to show the pattern repeats. Suggested placement for the markers is given on the first pattern row. They are placed on each side of the main repeat shown in brackets. These will help you to keep track of the pattern, and to spot any mistakes before you have gone too far past the error.

The pattern is written out in full as well as being shown in a chart.

Abbreviations

approx: Approximately

K: Knit

K2tog: Knit 2 stitches together

P: Purl

pm: Place stitch marker

RS: Right side

SSK: Slip 2 stitches knitwise to the right hand needle, pass the left hand needle tip into the front of these 2 stitches and knit them together

st(s): Stitch(es)

WS: Wrong side

yo: Pass yarn over needle to create a false stitch, this will make a hole in the knitted fabric

Size

Scarf size: Approx 14in x 94.5in [35cm x 240cm] relaxed, after blocking

Shawl size: Approx 22in x 78.5in [56cm x 200cm] relaxed, after blocking (Photographs show scarf size)

Yarn

Fyberspates Scrumptious Lace (45% silk, 55% merino; 100g skeins)
Water (504) 1 x 100g skein, both sizes

Shawl

Using US size 7 needles, cast on 72 (112) stitches loosely.

Knit 4 rows (garter stitch).

Now work in the following lace pattern, which is also shown on the chart.

Row 1 (RS): K9, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, pm, [K4, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, pm] 6 (11) times, K4, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K3.

Row 2 and all foll WS rows: K3, purl to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 3: K8, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K1, [K3, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K1] 6 (11) times, K3, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K4.

Row 5: K7, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K2, [K2, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K2] 6 (11) times, K2, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K5.

Row 7: K6, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K3, [K1, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K3] 6 (11) times, K1, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K6.

Row 9: K5, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K4, [K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K4] 6 (11) times, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K7.

Row 11: K4, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K4, K2tog, [yo, K2tog, yo, K4, K2tog] 6 (11) times, yo, K2tog, yo, K8.

Row 13: K3, K2tog, yo, K2tog, yo, K4, K2tog, yo, [K2tog, yo, K4, K2tog, yo] 6 (11) times, K2tog, yo, K9.

Row 15: K3, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K4, yo, SSK, [yo, SSK, K4, yo, SSK] 6 (11) times, yo, SSK, K9.

Row 17: K4, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K4, yo, [SSK, yo, SSK, K4, yo] 6 (11) times, SSK, yo, SSK, K8.

Row 19: K5, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K4, [yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K4] 6 (11) times, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K7.

Row 21: K6, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K3, [K1, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K3] 6 (11) times, K1, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K6.

Row 23: K7, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K2, [K2, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K2] 6 (11) times, K2, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K5.

Row 25: K8, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K1, [K3, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K1] 6 (11) times, K3, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K4.

Row 27: K9, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, [K4, yo, SSK, yo, SSK] 6 (11) times, K4, yo, SSK, yo, SSK, K3.

Row 28: As row 2.

Repeat rows 1-28 until piece measures 94 (78) in [239 (199) cm] or to desired length (a longer scarf or shawl will require more yarn).

Knit 4 rows to create garter stitch edge. Bind off loosely.

Finishing

Weave in all ends, but do not trim.

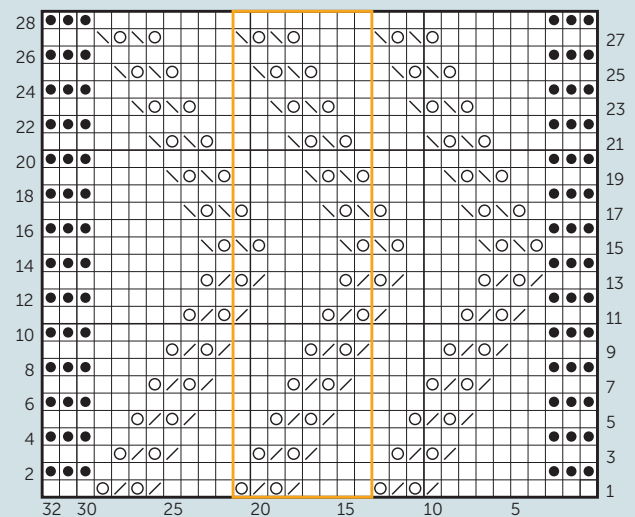
Soak the scarf/shawl in tepid water for at least 20 minutes. Squeeze gently to remove excess water, and pin out to measurements, stretching firmly to open up the lace pattern.

Allow to dry fully, unpin and trim ends.

Key

- Knit on RS, Purl on WS
- Purl on RS, Knit on WS
- SSK
- K2tog
- Yarnover
- Pattern repeat
